

Britons divided on urgency of tackling climate change post-COVID-19 pandemic

26 August 2021, London – Kantar Public publishes its latest barometer on British public opinion and voting intentions which finds people in Britain divided on the importance that should be assigned to tackling climate change, two-thirds who are concerned about further waves of COVID-19 after the summer, and a public in favour of COVID vaccinations for teenagers

Findings from Kantar Public's research which took place between 19th and 23rd August reveal that:

- 40% (+1 vs July 2021¹) of people think that following the end of the COVID-19 outbreak, actions to address climate change should be more of a priority for governments than before
- 37% (-6) think that there should be no change in priority levels of climate change and 14% think it should be less of a priority (+5)
- 75% approve/strongly approve that COVID-19 vaccinations are now available for 16- and 17-year-olds
- 62% strongly/tend to support that COVID-19 vaccinations being made available to 12 to 15-year-olds in the UK, whilst 20% oppose the idea
- Just under six in ten (59%, -1) think everyone should continue to wear face masks in shops and on public transport for a further period of time
- 43% say they think the government have handled the pandemic very/fairly well (-6) and 48% think very/fairly poorly (+3). This is the first time since February 2021 that more people are negative than positive about the government's pandemic handling
- 67% are very/fairly concerned that there will be further waves of COVID-19 infections after the summer; 28% are not very/ not at all concerned

The climate for climate change

This month's research finds that "tackling climate change and protecting the environment" remains a polarising issue. When asked to rank 11 policy areas in order of priority:

- 26% of the public put tackling climate change as one of their top three priorities for improving public life in the UK
- But 36% put it as one of their bottom three issues below policy areas such as healthcare, the economy, education, and unemployment

When it comes to the cooperation between countries to tackle climate change, over half of Britons rate it as very or fairly poor (56%), whilst 22% say it is very/fairly good.

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Attitudes towards COVID-19 and actions to tackle the pandemic

- 33% of people think the pace at which the government is adjusting the restrictions to everyday life is much/a bit too fast (-8) compared to almost two-fifths (38%, +5) who think it is 'about right'
- 64% (+2) of people strongly/tend to support the introduction of a vaccine passport to allow overseas travels into and out of the UK this summer, whilst 23% (no change) oppose the idea
- 48% (-5) say the government has been very/fairly good at communicating information about the COVID-19 outbreak, whilst 45% (+2) say the government has done very/fairly poorly in this
- 35% (-3) rate the cooperation between countries to distribute COVID-19 vaccines as very/fairly good, compared to 42% (-5) who say fairly/ very poor. 23% say they 'don't know' (+8)
- 38% (-1) think the government are placing too much emphasis on protecting the country's economy and not enough on protecting people's health, compared to 20% (+2) who think there is too much emphasis on health. 25% think they have got the balance about right (-2)

Household economic impacts

This month's research finds that 30% (-7) of Britons think the economy will be doing better in 12 months' time. Other findings include:

- 18% (-3) of those in work say their job feels safer than it was 12 months ago
- Of those working, 21% say their job feels less safe than 12 months ago (nc) which is the lowest figure since September 2019. 54% say much the same (+8)
- 6 in 10 (61%, +1) now say that their personal income "has not been impacted" by coronavirus, compared to 56% in March², 54% in February³ and 49% in January⁴
- Compared to last month, a smaller proportion of Britons say it is harder for them to meet their monthly household budget than it was 12 months ago: 24%, down from 28% in July

Notes to editors

When asked about the COVID-19 vaccines:

- Three quarters of people (72%, -4) say they are very/somewhat satisfied with the vaccine rollout organised by government and health authorities
- 44% (-7) think that vaccines should be compulsory for all adults, compared to 44% (+5) who think adults should be allowed to choose

When asked about the impact of the pandemic on personal savings, there is a mixed picture in Britain:

22% (-2) say their savings have decreased since the start of the pandemic, 41% (nc) say they have stayed the same, and 19% (-1) say their savings have increased

- Of the people who saved extra money, only 3% (-8) of them intend to spend it all by the end of the year. 60% (-3) who have saved extra money say that they will only spend "some of it" or "none at all" this year

A total of 1,094 interviews were conducted online among adults living in Great Britain between the 19th and 23rd August 2021. All interviews were conducted online using the Kantar Research Express. The Kantar online access panel was the main sample source.

Polling Methodological Note – August 2021

A representative sample of 1,094 adults in Great Britain were interviewed between the 19th and 23rd August 2021. All interviews were conducted online using the Kantar Research Express. The Kantar online access panel was the main sample source.

The data was weighted to match population totals for age, gender, 2019 General Election voting patterns, 2016 EU referendum voting patterns, education, region, and likelihood to vote in the next General Election. Further details on the weighting are given on page two.

Voting intentions

The voting intention figures provided aim to show the current political opinion of the nation rather than to accurately predict the outcome of the next General Election.

As well as weighting the data, a Likelihood to Vote (LTV) Model has been used to estimate the voting probability of each respondent. These probabilities vary by stated likelihood of voting and whether reported voting in the 2019 general election. The probabilities themselves are based on those of respondents that participated in our polls immediately before and after the 2019 General Election.

Uncertainty

All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error. On the basis of the historical record of the polls at recent general elections, there is a 9 in 10 chance that the true value of a party's support lies within 4 points of the estimates provided by this poll, and a 2 in 3 chance that it lies within 2 points.

Sampling variance

We have estimated the sampling variation in our voting intention estimates using the methodology proposed by Kuha and Sturgis (2017¹). Bootstrap resampling was used to draw fifty sets of respondents from the achieved sample (in a way which matched the quota sampling design), each of these new samples was weighted and we have then used the distribution of estimates (from the resamples) to calculate margins of error (the range containing all but the two most extreme resample results).

- Conservative Party = 35.3% to 41.6%
- Labour Party = 31.4% to 37.3%
- Conservative lead over Labour = -0.7%pts to 9.7%pts

Likelihood to Vote in General Election

We have estimated the likelihood that each respondent will vote in the next General Election. This value is based on respondents' stated intention to vote and whether they voted in the last general election. The expected population turnout has been included as a population total in the weighting matrix. This turnout has been estimated based on the relationship between sample and population turnout rates in the 2017 general election.
