## Over two thirds of Britons are concerned that they will not be able to afford to keep their homes warm this winter

**15 December 2022, London** – Kantar Public’s latest barometer reveals that just over two thirds of Britons are concerned that they will not be able to afford to keep their homes warm this winter and that six in ten are finding it harder to meet their monthly household budget compared to a year ago.

Kantar Public’s research took place between the afternoon of 8 December and 12 December.

### Key findings include:

- Over two thirds of Britons (68%) are very/fairly concerned that they will not be able to afford to keep their homes warm enough this winter. This is an increase of +7%pts compared to December 2021<sup>1</sup>.
- 59% of Britons said they were finding it harder to meet their monthly household budget compared to 41% a year ago (+18 vs December 2021).
- Britons are increasingly divided over whether, in general, they support recent strikes around pay and conditions announced by a number of professional bodies:
  - 46% generally strongly/slightly support the strikes (+4 vs November 2022<sup>2</sup>)
  - 43% generally strongly/slightly oppose the strikes (+4)
  - 10% of Britons don’t know whether they support or oppose the strikes (-9)
- When asked about strike action among people in specific professions:
  - Britons were most likely to strongly/slightly support strike action among: Nurses (54%), Ambulance workers (50%) and Firefighters (48%).
  - They were most likely to strongly/slightly oppose strike action among: Driving test examiners (51%), University staff (51%), Railway workers (50%) and Airport baggage handlers (50%).

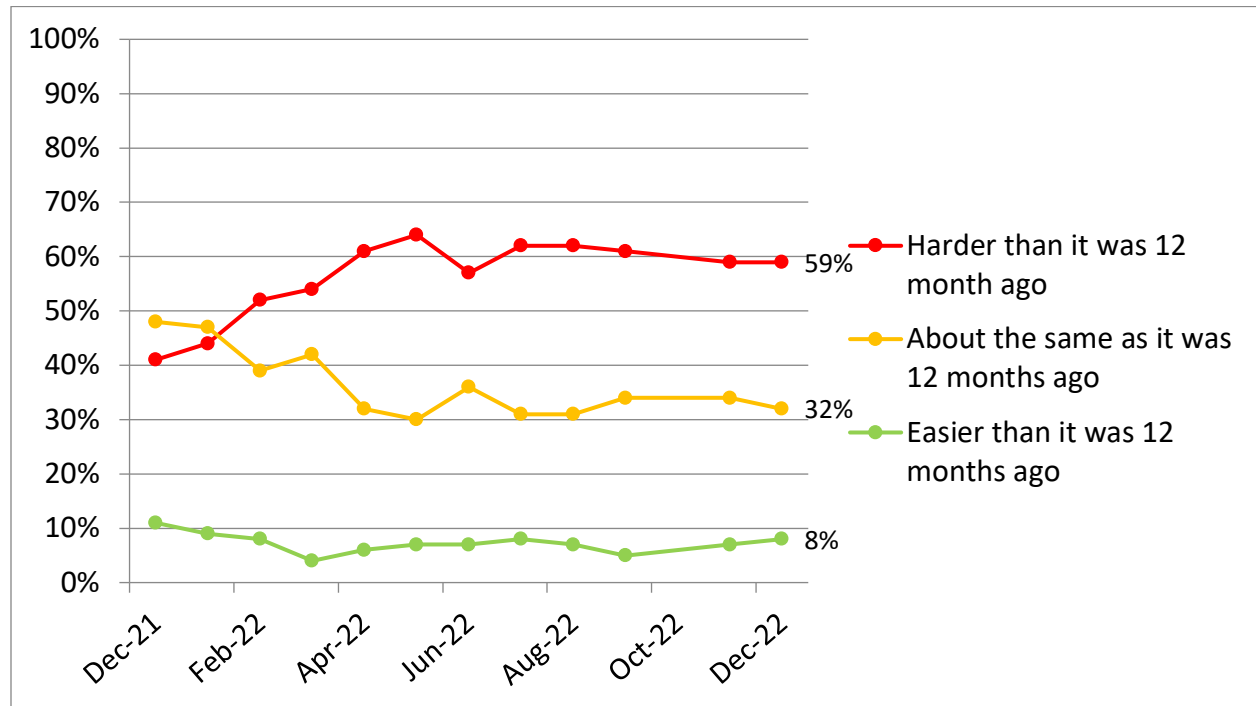

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## More detailed analysis on themes:

### 1. Household-level economic situation

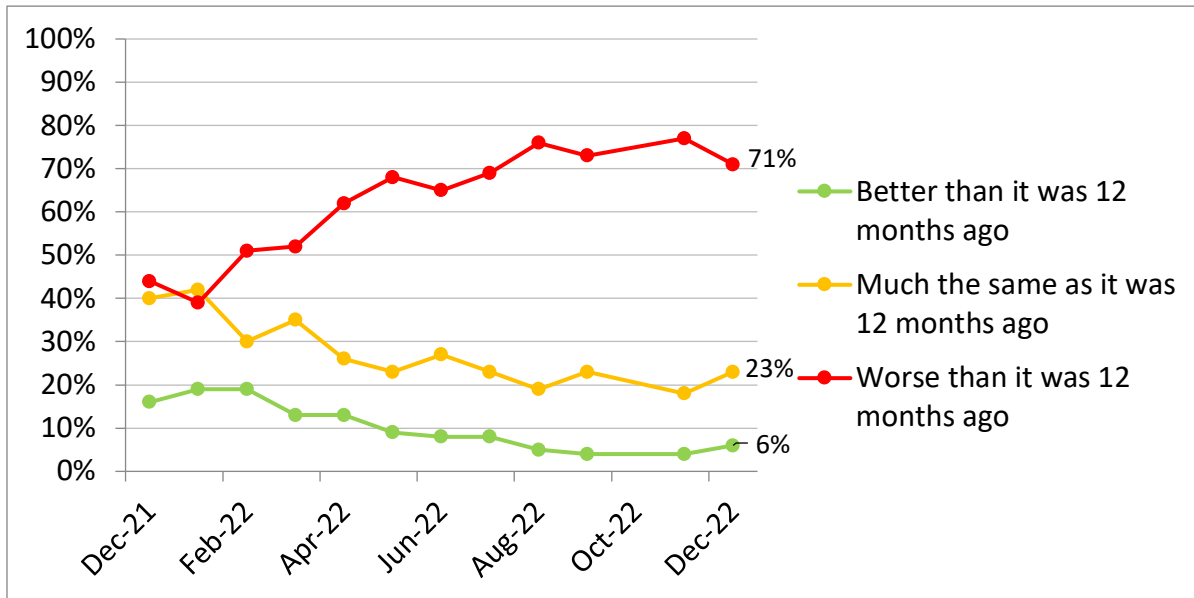
- The chart below shows that the portion of Britons finding it harder to meet their household budget has increased over the last year, reaching a high of 64% in May 2022 and has remained relatively stable through the latter half of the year.
- **Chart 1: Compared to a year ago, do you find it easier or harder to meet your monthly household budget? Would you say it is...?**



- 71% think the British economy is doing worse than it was a year ago (-6 vs November 2022). 23% think it is doing much the same (+5) but only 6% think it is doing better (+2).
- The chart below shows the portion of Britons that think the economy is doing worse than a year ago has increased over the last year from 44% in December 2021, while the proportion who think it is doing better has decreased from 16% in December 2021.

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Chart 2: Compared to a year ago, do you think the British economy is doing...?

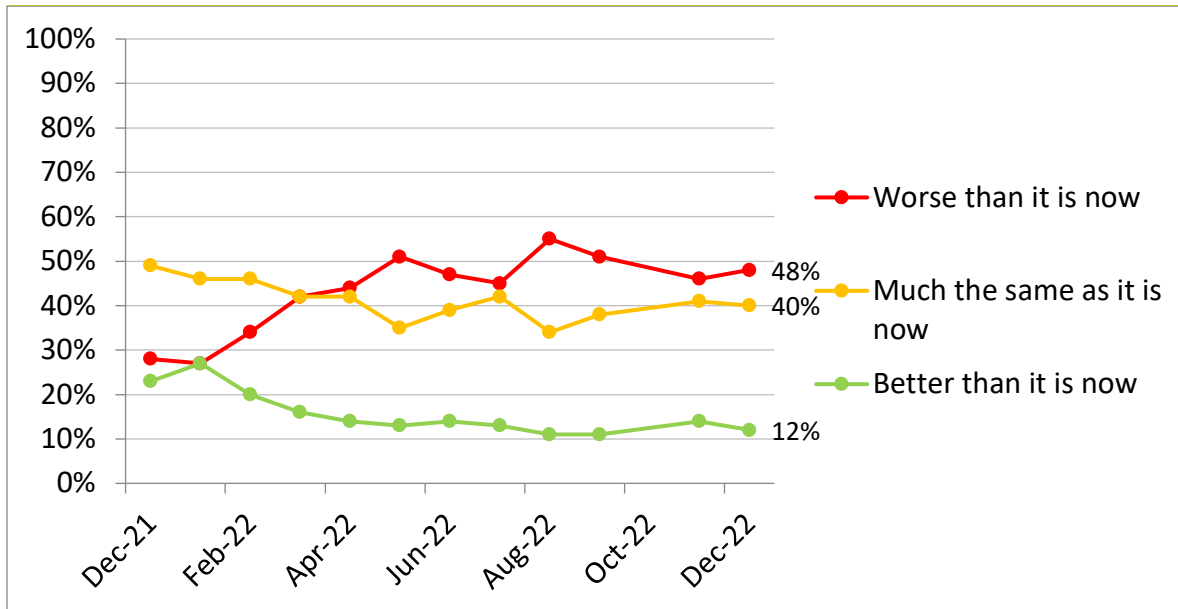


- Just under half of Britons (48%) think that the British economy will be doing worse than it is now in a years' time (+2 Vs November 2022). 12% think that it will be doing better than it is now (-2).
- The chart below shows the proportion of Britons who think the economy will be doing worse in a years' time increased from 28% in December 2021, peaking at 55% in August 2022<sup>3</sup>. The portion of Britons that think the economy will be doing better than it is now has decreased from 23% in December 2021.

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Chart 3: Thinking about the year ahead, do you think the economy will be doing...?



- Just over two thirds of Britons (68%) are very/fairly concerned that they will not be able to afford to keep their homes warm enough this winter (+7 vs January 2022<sup>4</sup>). A quarter of Britons (27%) are not very or not at all concerned that they will not be able to afford to keep their homes warm enough this winter (-7 vs January 2022). Only 5% said they did not know (-1).
- Over half (59%) of Britons said they were finding it harder to meet their monthly household budget compared to a year ago (nc vs November 2022). This is 18%pts higher than in December 2021, when 41% of Britons said they were finding it harder.
- Around three quarters of Britons (77%, +4 vs November 2022) think the government is handling cost of living very/fairly poorly. 17% (nc) think the government has handled the crisis very/fairly well. 7% are not sure (-4).

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## 2. Strikes

Britons are increasingly divided over whether, in general, they support recent strikes around pay and conditions announced by a number of professional bodies:

- 46% strongly/slightly support the strikes (+4 vs November)
  - 71% of 2019 Labour voters strongly/slightly support the strikes (-2).
  - A majority of 18-24 year-olds support the strikes (57%, +18), 54% of those aged between 25-34 years old (+4) support the strikes.
- 43% strongly/slightly oppose the strikes (+4 vs November 2022)
  - 71% of 2019 Conservative voters oppose the strikes (+9).
  - Six in ten (60%) of those aged 65+ oppose the strikes (+2). Nearly half (47%, +2 of those aged 55-64 oppose the strikes.
- 10% of Britons don't know whether they support or oppose the strikes (-9 vs November 2022)

When asked about strike action among people in specific professions, the public remains divided.

- Britons were most likely to strongly/slightly support strike action among:
  - **Nurses** (54% support and 36% oppose)
  - **Ambulance workers** (50% support and 40% oppose)
  - **Firefighters** (48% support and 41% oppose)
- They were most likely to strongly/slightly oppose strike action among:
  - **Driving test examiners** (51% oppose and 31% support)
  - **University staff** (51% oppose and 35% support)
  - **Railway workers** (50% oppose and 40% support)
  - **Airport baggage handlers** (50% oppose and 37% support)
- Britons were more evenly divided over whether they support or oppose strike action among:
  - **Teachers:** 45% of Britons strongly/slightly oppose teachers striking over pay and conditions. 44% strongly/slightly support
  - **Doctors:** 47% of Britons strongly/slightly oppose doctors striking, 43% of Britons strong/slightly support them.
  - **Postal workers:** 46% Britons strongly/slightly oppose postal workers striking, 42% of Britons strong/slightly support them.

### 3. Brexit

When asked how they would vote if a new referendum on EU membership was held:

- 37% of Britons said they would vote to apply to join the EU (+2 vs June 2022<sup>5</sup>)
  - 14% of those who voted to leave the EU in 2016 would now vote to apply to join the EU (+5)
  - 32% of those that did not vote in the 2016 referendum say they would now vote to apply (+2)
- 27% said they would vote to stay out of the EU (-7 vs June 2022)
  - 11% of those who voted to remain in the EU in 2016 would vote to stay out of the EU (-7)
  - 8% of those that did not vote in the 2016 referendum say they would now vote to leave (-5)
- 20% said they would not vote (+2)
- 15% did not know (+3)

When asked whether it was right or wrong for Britain to vote to leave the EU in 2016:

- 35% of Britons say Britain was right to vote to leave the EU in 2016
  - Three quarters (75%) of those who voted to leave the EU in 2016 say Britain was right to do so.
  - 9% of those who voted to remain in 2016, say Britain was right to vote to leave in 2016
- 45% of Britons say Britain was wrong to vote to leave the EU in 2016
  - 82% of those who voted to remain in the EU in 2016, say Britain was wrong to vote to leave the EU
  - 17% of those who voted to leave the EU in 2016, say Britain was wrong to vote to leave the EU
- 20% of Britons don’t know where Britain was right or wrong to leave the EU in 2016

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### Methodological information

The survey data and further details on the methodological approach of the Britain Barometer will be published here on the morning of Thursday 15 December.

A total of 1,097 interviews were conducted online among adults living in Great Britain between the 8 and 12 December 2022. All interviews were conducted online using the Kantar Research Express. The Kantar Profiles online access panel was the main sample source.

The data was weighted to match population totals for age, gender, 2019 General Election voting patterns, 2016 EU referendum voting patterns, education, region, and likelihood to vote in the next General Election. Any use of this research must cite Kantar Public as the source.

## Polling Methodological Note – December 2022

A representative sample of 1,097 adults in Great Britain were interviewed between the 8<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> December 2022. All interviews were conducted online using the Kantar Research Express. The Kantar online access panel was the main sample source.

The data was weighted to match population totals for age, gender, 2019 General Election voting patterns, 2016 EU referendum voting patterns, education, region, and likelihood to vote in the next General Election. Further details on the weighting are given on page two.

### Voting intentions

The voting intention figures provided aim to show the current political opinion of the nation rather than to accurately predict the outcome of the next General Election.

As well as weighting the data, a Likelihood to Vote (LTV) Model has been used to estimate the voting probability of each respondent. These probabilities vary by stated likelihood of voting and whether reported voting in the 2019 general election. The probabilities themselves are based on those of respondents that participated in our polls immediately before and after the 2019 General Election.

### Past vote weighting

When weighting the data, Kantar seek to ensure that the sample is politically representative. One element of this is to use information provided by respondents about whether they voted for in the 2019 general election and – if so – which party they voted for. Where this information is missing, we impute it based on other information respondents have provided. In the past, we weighted our poll sample to match the election results exactly (including the correct number of non-voters in the general population).

We have re-analysed all the polls we have conducted since the last general election to identify how reports of voting behaviour have changed since December 2019. This study found a decline in the probability that a 2019 Conservative voter will now report having voted Conservative in that election. If the outcomes from this study are ignored when we weight our data, 2019 Conservative voters will be over-represented in the sample. Consequently, we now incorporate the results from this study when constructing the target political profile we weight our sample to. We will update this profile regularly as more data is collected.

## Uncertainty

All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error. On the basis of the historical record of the polls at recent general elections, there is a 9 in 10 chance that the true value of a party's support lies within 4 points of the estimates provided by this poll, and a 2 in 3 chance that it lies within 2 points.

## Sampling variance

We have estimated the sampling variation in our voting intention estimates using the methodology proposed by Kuha and Sturgis (2017<sup>1</sup>). Bootstrap resampling was used to draw fifty sets of respondents from the achieved sample (in a way which matched the quota sampling design), each of these new samples was weighted and we have then used the distribution of estimates (from the resamples) to calculate margins of error (the range containing all but the two most extreme resample results).

- Conservative Party = 25.5% to 31.7%
- Labour Party = 42.2% to 48.7%
- Labour lead over Conservatives = 11.7%pts to 22.3%pts

## Likelihood to Vote in General Election

We have estimated the likelihood that each respondent will vote in the next General Election. This value is based on respondents' stated intention to vote and whether they voted in the last general election. The expected population turnout has been included as a population total in the weighting matrix. This turnout has been estimated based on the relationship between sample and population turnout rates in the 2017 general election.
