

Half of Britons are concerned about keeping their home warm over winter

30 September 2021, London – Kantar Public publishes its latest barometer on British public opinion and voting intentions which finds people in Britain are concerned about being able to keep their home warm enough this winter, an increasing proportion are pessimistic about the future of the economy, and Britons are divided over the adult social care reforms with only a third supporting a tax rise to increase funding for adult social care.

Key findings from Kantar Public's research which took place between 23rd and 27th September reveal that:

- Half of Britons (53%) are very/fairly concerned about not being able to keep their home warm enough this winter; 40% are not very/not at all concerned.
- One in five (21%) of people are behind with some or all of their household bills; 72% are up to date with their bills.
- A majority (58%) would be willing to change the way they live and work to help reduce the effects of climate change
- 44% of Britons strongly/tend to support the government's proposed reforms to adult social care, while 27% oppose. 30% of Britons are unsure if they support or oppose these reforms.
- However, only 33% of the public support raising taxes to increase spending on adult social care. A third (35%) want taxes and spending to be kept unchanged, and a quarter (23%) are unsure.
- 28% of the public (+8 vs August 2021¹) think the economy will be doing worse in 12 months' time, while 24% (-6) think the economy will be doing better in 12 months' time.
- And 71% of Britons are very/fairly concerned that there will be further waves of COVID-19 infections through the autumn and winter.

Household-level economic impacts

This month's research finds Britons are more pessimistic about the future of the economy than a month ago. There is increasing concern about job security, making ends meet and paying household bills:

- Just over a quarter (28%, +8) now think the economy will be doing worse in 12 months' time; 24% (-6) of Britons think the economy will be doing better in 12 months' time.
- Three-in-ten (30%) are finding it harder to meet their monthly household budget than a year ago (+6). 60% are finding it about the same (-7) and 9% are finding it easier (no change).
- Half of Britons (53%) are very/fairly concerned about not being able to keep their home warm enough this winter; 40% are not very/not at all concerned.
- 21% of people say they are behind with some or all of their household bills; 72% are up to date with their bills.

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- Of those working, 21% say their job feels less safe than 12 months ago (nc) which remains the lowest figure since September 2019.

Attitudes towards adult social care reforms

Britons are divided over the government's reforms to adult social care, with 44% saying they strongly support/tend to support these reforms; 27% oppose to them, while 30% of Britons are unsure about their position. Other findings include:

- More than one third (35%) of Britons support keeping taxes, and spending on adult social care the same level as now. One third (33%) of Britons support increasing taxes and spending more on adult social care, whilst 9% support reducing taxes and spending less on adult social care. 23% are unsure.
- When asked which political party they trust the most on the issue of adult social care:
 - Half of Britons (53%) did not know who which political party they trusted the most.
 - 16% trusted Labour the most and 16% trusted the Conservative party the most. 5% trusted the Liberal Democrats the most.

The climate for climate change in Britain

A majority of people (58%) say that they would be willing to make a lot of changes / some changes to how they live and work to help reduce the effects of climate change; one-fifth (19%) would be willing to make only a few changes and 12% would not be willing to make any changes. Other findings include:

- 26% (+4) of Britons rate global cooperation between countries to tackle climate change as very good/good. 53% (-3) rate it as very poor/poor.
- 39% (-1) of people think that following the end of the COVID-19 outbreak, actions to address climate change should be more of a priority for governments than before

Attitudes towards COVID-19 vaccination

A large majority of the public (71%, representing a +4pt increase vs. last month) are very/fairly concerned that there will be further waves of COVID-19 infections through the autumn and winter; while 23% (-5) are not very/not at all concerned.

In response to questions about the COVID-19 vaccines:

- Three quarters of Britons (74%, +2) say they are very/somewhat satisfied with the vaccine rollout organised by the government and health authorities.
- 47% (+3) think that vaccines should be compulsory for all adults. 41% (-3) think that adults should be allowed to choose.
- 62% approve/strongly approve of vaccinations being available to children 12-15 years old, while 18% oppose the idea.
- 39% (+4) rate the cooperation between countries to distribute COVID-19 vaccines as very/fairly good, compared to 42% (nc) who say fairly/ very poor. 20% say they 'don't know' (-3)

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Voting intentions (Note: the majority of fieldwork was conducted prior to the weekend when the Labour Party's 2021 Annual Conference took place and fuel stations began experiencing shortages):

- Con 43% (+6 vs August 2021)
- Lab 30% (-4)
- L Dem 11% (-3)
- Green 6% (+1)
- SNP 4% (nc)
- Reform UK (formerly Brexit Party) 1% (-1)
- UKIP 1% (-1)
- Plaid Cymru 1% (nc)
- Other 1% (+1)

Notes to editors

When asked about the impact of the pandemic on personal income and savings, there is a mixed picture in Britain:

- 25% (+3) say their savings have decreased since the start of the pandemic, 37% (-4) say they have stayed the same, and 19% (nc) say their savings have increased
- Of the people who saved extra money, only 5% (+2) of them intend to spend it all by the end of the year. 64% (+4) who have saved extra money say that they will only spend "some of it" or "none at all" this year
- 6 in 10 (58%, -3) now say that their personal income "has not been impacted" by coronavirus.

A total of 1,089 interviews were conducted online among adults living in Great Britain between the 23rd and 27th September 2021. All interviews were conducted online using the Kantar Research Express. The Kantar online access panel was the main sample source.

Polling Methodological Note – September 2021

A representative sample of 1,089 adults in Great Britain were interviewed between the 23rd and 27th September 2021. All interviews were conducted online using the Kantar Research Express. The Kantar online access panel was the main sample source.

The data was weighted to match population totals for age, gender, 2019 General Election voting patterns, 2016 EU referendum voting patterns, education, region, and likelihood to vote in the next General Election. Further details on the weighting are given on page two.

Voting intentions

The voting intention figures provided aim to show the current political opinion of the nation rather than to accurately predict the outcome of the next General Election.

As well as weighting the data, a Likelihood to Vote (LTV) Model has been used to estimate the voting probability of each respondent. These probabilities vary by stated likelihood of voting and whether reported voting in the 2019 general election. The probabilities themselves are based on those of respondents that participated in our polls immediately before and after the 2019 General Election.

Uncertainty

All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error. On the basis of the historical record of the polls at recent general elections, there is a 9 in 10 chance that the true value of a party's support lies within 4 points of the estimates provided by this poll, and a 2 in 3 chance that it lies within 2 points.

Sampling variance

We have estimated the sampling variation in our voting intention estimates using the methodology proposed by Kuha and Sturgis (2017¹). Bootstrap resampling was used to draw fifty sets of respondents from the achieved sample (in a way which matched the quota sampling design), each of these new samples was weighted and we have then used the distribution of estimates (from the resamples) to calculate margins of error (the range containing all but the two most extreme resample results).

- Conservative Party = 40.1% to 45.8%
- Labour Party = 28.0% to 33.9%
- Conservative lead over Labour = 6.9%pts to 16.8%pts

Likelihood to Vote in General Election

We have estimated the likelihood that each respondent will vote in the next General Election. This value is based on respondents' stated intention to vote and whether they voted in the last general election. The expected population turnout has been included as a population total in the weighting matrix. This turnout has been estimated based on the relationship between sample and population turnout rates in the 2017 general election.
